Reporting Concerns about Driving in Nova Scotia

If you are a healthcare provider:

- Contact Driver Licensing by email (<u>medicalfitness@novascotia.ca</u>) to report your concerns.
- Complete the <u>Driver's Medical Examination Report</u> or a letter indicating why you have concerns about the person with dementia's driving and why you are recommending that they no longer drive.
- Provide the driver's name, date of birth and diagnosis.
- The driver's license may be suspended and a letter sent to the driver to advise them of next steps.

If you are a family member, friend, concerned citizen:

- Contact Driver Licensing by email (<u>medicalfitness@novascotia.ca</u>) to report your concerns.
- Provide your name and contact information as well as the driver's name and their date of birth (if you know it).
- The Nova Scotia Medical Fitness unit will review the information and may send the driver a letter requesting a Medical Review.
